#### **RESEARCH IN PROGRESS**

My book, *Regions of War and Peace*, and other recent work (“African Lessons...” etc.) investigate important regional variations challenging global IR theory and research. This work suggests substantial changes to how we theorize about world politics and also assess relationships empirically. I am now investigating how progress toward state making conditions states’ international behaviors and how their state making efforts are, in turn, influenced by international politics. Part of this involves gathering data on state like entities across the developing world, in order to address the regional variations uncovered in my, and other, work and to provide a representative sample of political actors attempting to build states.
