We are interested in candidates at the assistant professor rank. This is a university year appointment. Promise of excellence in research and teaching is required.

The position is open with respect to subfield. For example, our interest includes, but is not limited to, candidates who study domestic energy policy and regulation, international institutions and bargaining over energy resources, the comparative political economy of oil production, legislative behavior on energy reforms, the impact of federalism on diffusion and innovation in renewable energy policies, and cross-national variation in the role of NGOs and the state in the development of alternative energy technologies. Applications received by September 15, 2009 will be given first consideration, although we will accept applications after that date.
