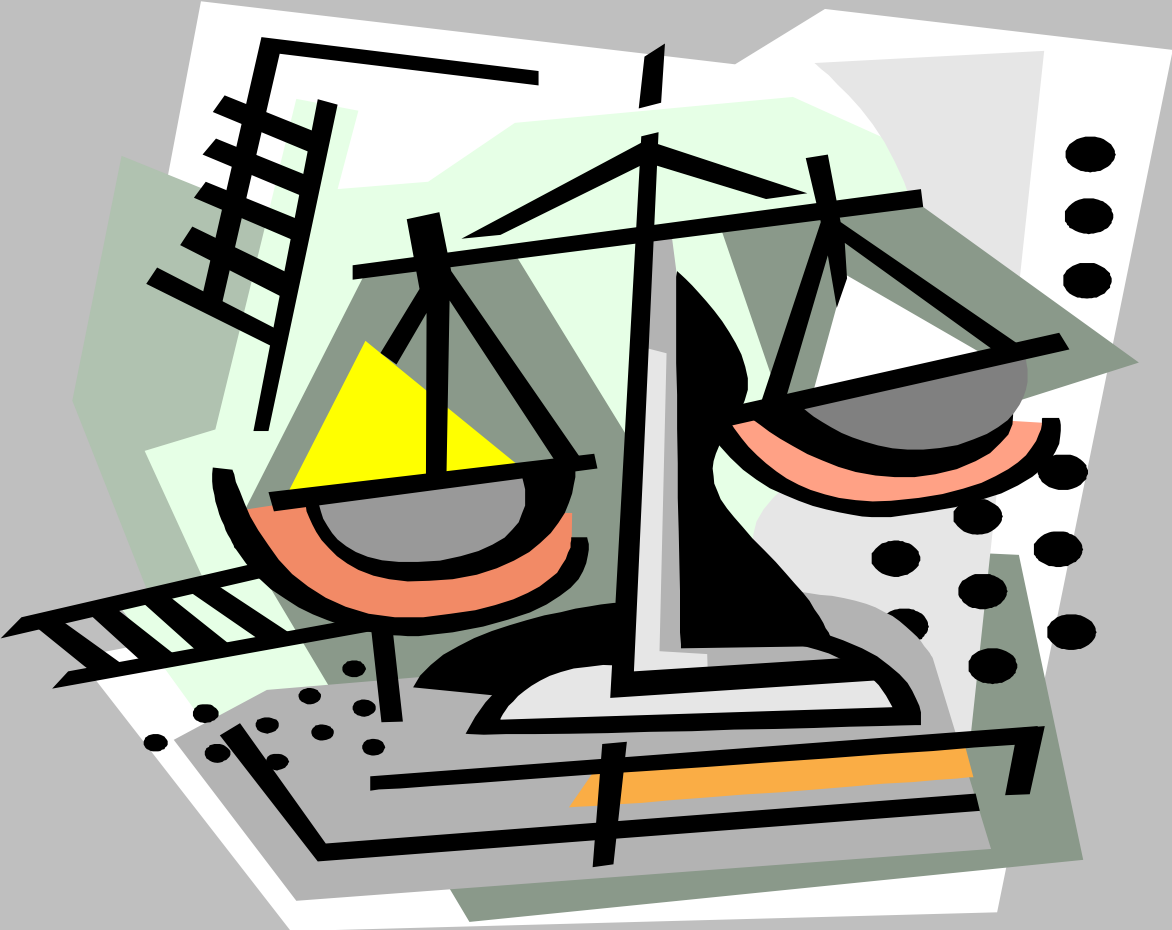

INTRODUCTION

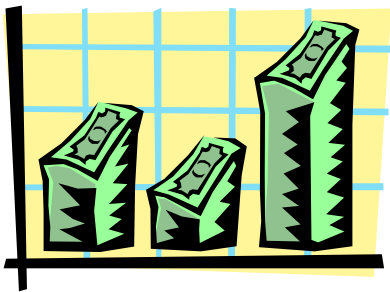
This guide introduces sources of funding for dissertation research. The department expects students to seek external support for dissertations and other projects, just as faculty members do. Research awards help you cover the costs of primary data collection, library use, and write-up. They are important signals of success too.

Usually students prepare research proposals for funding during the winter term of the second year and the summer between the second and third years. They submit these proposals to NSF, SSRC, and other organizations in the fall term of the third year in order to carry out primary research in the fourth year. Missing the deadlines adds at least a year to the time-to-degree.

Most students take a research design class in the major field in order to develop successful proposals.

Note: Please check deadlines for late changes. The deadlines in brackets are based on past experience.

Graduate Student Instructorships

Departmental Deadline:

[February 1] This award includes a full tuition fellowship, health care benefits and a stipend. Students are assigned as Graduate Student Instructors in the Department's undergraduate classes. Partial appointments (graderships) are available for upper-level classes. Assignments are also made for English Composition Board classes.

Dissertation/Thesis Grant

Departmental Deadline:

[October 30-March 30] To defray research related expenses of dissertation or thesis research (normally \$250 to \$2,500) awards. Students should submit a budget, an evaluation from the thesis advisor and a prospectus.

Departmental Deadline:

[March 1] Awards are given to students writing dissertations in the field of American Government and Politics. Awards include a stipend and a fund for research expenses. The criteria for selection include letters of recommendation, dissertation prospectus and academic record.

Fellowships Departmental Deadline: [March 1] Awards are given to women candidates who have a cumulative GPA of 7.6 or higher. One nomination per department.

Rackham One-Term Dissertation Grant Deadline:

[March 1] These are write up grants that include tuition, stipend and grad care. This grant may be used to fund Spring/Summer, Fall or the Winter semester of the academic year.

Rackham Predoctoral Fellowship Deadline:

[November 15] For doctoral students who have achieved candidacy and are near completion of their degree. Stipend of \$15,600 over 12 months, candidacy tuition for three terms, and GradCare health insurance. Students must be nominated by the department.



Rackham Discretionary Fund NO DEADLINE This limited fund is intended to assist students in meeting emergencies or situations beyond the student's control not covered by other programs of funding. A student may not receive discretionary grants more than once each fiscal year (July to June).
